CARE & MAINTENANCE

1. Put a drop of oil on center of all springs now and then.
2. Clean surface and clear shields with Novus before playing. Spread polish with a Bounty paper towel; dry with another. Clean pucks, rods, grips and frame with damp Novus towel. Do not use any cleaner with ammonia or alcohol on shields.
3. Wipe grips with ArmorAll now and then to preserve rubber and lessen the carbon black transfer to your fingertips. A damp washcloth nearby keeps hands clean.
4. Repair any torn or loose grip ends or under ice bumpers with a small drop of superglue gel, applied with toothpick.
5. Repair any enlarged dimple on goalie or player peg with a drop of clear nail polish. Prop up player; let dry 15 minutes.
6. Repair any stripped threads in nylon spring bushings by removing setscrew to dish, then resurfacing threads with a drop of nail polish. Spread in hole with toothpick and let dry.
7. Touch up ice linework with red or royal enamel and art brush. Small bottles of Testor's paints can be found at hobby shops.
8. When the yellow box and clear clamp snap effect becomes soft, remove box and clamp, squeeze close the opening of clamp, then remount to game. Easy does it removing pucks from box.
9. Cover game with tablecloth or beach towel when not in use.
10. Use carrying handle by removing walnut shelf, yellow boxes, pucks, pegs and tools to shoe box, then folding legs to frame.
11. Cover for storage or hang well on wall, making a neat 3-D sculpture, and a reminder of all the good times.
